Be Part Of The Campaign For Safer Internet – February 10, 2026

Ghana will commemorate Africa Safer Internet Day on Tuesday February 10, 2026, under the theme "**Together for a Safer Africa Online: AU Online Safety Policy in Action.**"

Safeguarding children online is a shared responsibility for all stakeholders, including parents, teachers, caregivers, civil society organisations, and the media.

The Africa Safer Internet Day is one of the opportunities for intensified awareness creation on online safety for children; a task that the Cyber Security Authority (CSA) cannot handle alone.

This year's initiative aims to promote the goals of the AU Online Safety Policy, which includes harmonizing legal frameworks, education, and stakeholder capacity building to protect and empower children in Africa who face increasing risks: harmful content, online abuse, sexual exploitation, cyberbullying, privacy breaches, and emerging threats like AI-driven harms.

The Policy establishes key principles such as children's right to safety, privacy, and online participation, with prime importance attached to children's best interests and support to Member States to develop strategies and programs to promote child online safety and empowerment.

The Cyber Security Authority will lead intensified awareness and education efforts targeted at children in schools, churches, and communities.

Together, let us create a truly safer online environment for our children.
